40 YEARS OF OCCUPATION

In 1971, hundreds of young people claimed the 85 acres of an abandoned 17th-century military base in the urban center of Copenhagen, Denmark as their home. They declared this area a free state, and named it Christiania. Finding it politically unpopular to evict the young settlers, the Danish government declared Christiania a "short-term social experiment".

Over 40 years later, Christiania is the oldest still-existing squatter community in Europe.
